3) Steps to chlorination of water

Next, the water is pumped into a tank which has a bed of fine sand at the bottom.

In this process, chlorine gas is bubbled through the water and it kills any remaining bacteria.

First of all the water is pumped to settling tanks.

The water filters through the sand, leaving impurities behind.

In the settling tanks, a chemical called alum is added to help the impurities sink to the bottom. It then goes on to the final stage chlorination.
