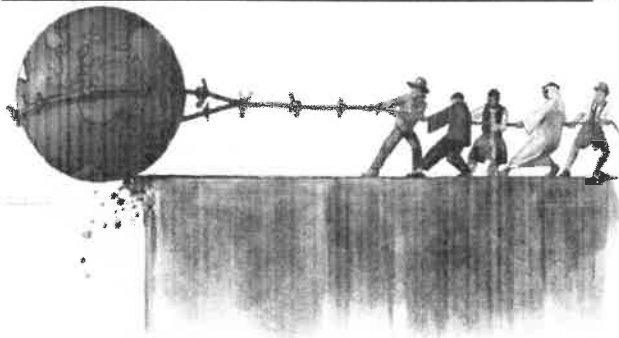
Informal Letter
